Teaching schedule	<p>April [Orientation] The objectives of the lesson, procedure, assignment submission, evaluation, the relationship with the Graduation Thesis II, and considerations will be discussed. Research theme of each teacher will be introduced.</p> <p>First semester [consultation to teachers] Students will consult teachers to select research theme. The consulted teacher and research theme will be reported to the organizer teacher. The students will continue research on the theme by using summer holidays, etc.</p> <p>Second semester [interim report] The students will advance the study on the research theme and submit the progress report by the end of semester, to determine the responsible teacher.</p> <p>Third semester [final report] The students will submit the final report on the study on research theme. (Preferably, the report should review on a specific theme and present the issues to be clarified, or alternatively, the research objectives and hypotheses should be presented.) The final reporting session will be held.</p>
Course conditions	The course is targeted to the students who belong to the College of Disability Sciences only.
