Course overview	The course will enable students to learn not only nursing care skills, but also summarized knowledge necessary for medical/nursing workers. Taking this course will not provide students with an immediate solution, but provide them with an opportunity and material to consider solutions. The course will encourage students to learn diseases, disabilities, and cares together.
